Aviation Scholarships Rose Lepore, Aviation Scholarship Advisor

The South Central Section AE Scholarship Committee has completed its review of the 2012 applications. This year we received eight (8) applications for AE Scholarships, and three (3) New Pilot Award applications. The application form packets had changed slightly this year—applicants had to read the instructions carefully to be sure their applications were complete The members of the committee who do such a great job of reviewing applications year after year are Clancey Maloney, Becky Hempel and Cathy Wappler. I may be their leader, but I'm always rushing to catch them. They are all committee to helping applicants achieve their aviation goals.

Of the eight (8) applications submitted, four (4) were forwarded to the Trustees for further consideration. The Section quota for AE Scholarship applications this year was seven (7) applications and four (4) " strong" alternates. All 3 New Pilot Award applications were sent to the Trustees. The following are the applications selected by the Committee to be sent to the Trustees:

- Aileen Watkins Houston (Academic)
- Sarah Preedy Ambassador (A320 Type Rating)
- Kirsten Brazier Ambassador (Group IV (Helicopters) Instrument Rating)
- Laura Flanagan Ambassador (A320 Type Rating)
- Kristi Rodriguez Pikes Peak (New Pilot Award)
- Michal Hillary Mudd Rio Grande Norte (New Pilot Award)
- Kara Gallas Colorado(New Pilot Award)

The four (4) applications we did not forward to the Trustees had problems we were not able to resolve before the deadline for submission. Three (3) were not forwarded because they lacked required hours, particularly PIC Cross-Country time. One lacked the total time needed for a Commercial ASEL rating. Most of these ladies have indicated they'll be back next year.

There is clearly some confusion about what hours can and cannot be included in the requested training. Before submitting applications, applicants and Chapter AE Chairmen should:

- Check the FARs to be sure they know what's required for each rating sought
- Read the application instructions very carefully to be sure all eligibility requirements are met, including the correct medical needed
- Get an early start on the process---try to get the application packet as soon as it's available on the website and allow sufficient time to seek help and get questions answered well before the submission deadline
- Your SCS AE Scholarship committee is willing to help, don't hesitate to e-mail us with questions, etc. (We're all in the directory)

The number of applications submitted this year was disappointing. I know there must be more Ninety-Nines out there who could meet the eligibility requirements and would like to advance their aviation goals. If you're one of those, visit the website, review the application forms when they become available for 2013, and go for it! You will find there are plenty of former winners, fellow Chapter members, as well as your scholarship committee who would be happy to help you.

Remember, information about other aviation scholarships is available on the Ninety-Nines website. Several of these have links to specific websites.

Ninety-Nines International Awards

Each year, The Ninety-Nines recognizes outstanding contributions to aviation by honoring individuals both inside and outside the organization. Nominations are accepted beginning in the fall and continuing until January 15. Chapters are encouraged to nominate individuals who deserve recognition for their contributions to The Ninety-Nines, to aviation, or to humanitarian efforts.

This year, two individuals from the South Central Section received these prestigious awards – Deborah Rihn-Harvey (Houston Chapter) received the Award of Achievement for Contributions to Aviation and Dean Jaros was honored posthumously with the George Palmer Putnam Award.

For more than forty years, Debby Rihn-Harvey has contributed her time and energy to the field of aviation as an instructor, airline captain, aviation business owner, FAA Designated Pilot Examiner, mentor, airshow pilot, and the longest-standing member of the United States Aerobatic Team. While still active in all of these endeavors, Debby finds time to advise and inspire a new generation of aviation professionals and enthusiasts.

Her dedication to the sport of aerobatics places her among the world's elite pilots. In 2006, Debby became the third woman in history to be crowned United States National Aerobatic Champion, winning that title again in 2008 and 2009. As 2006, 2008 and 2009 U.S. National Aerobatic Champion, Debby was awarded the Mike Murphy Cup. She has also won the Betty Skelton Trophy (awarded to the top-placing woman competitor in the Powered Unlimited category at the U.S. Nationals) an unprecedented twelve times. In world competition, Rihn-Harvey has been a gold medalist and holds many regional titles.

Debby is an active air show performer, Aerobatic Competency Evaluator (ACE) through the International Council of Air Shows (ICAS), and an FAA Designated Examiner. She also manages Harvey & Rihn Aviation, a flight school and fixed base operation in La Porte, Texas. Since 1979, her aerobatics school has attracted pilots from around the world. Debby serves on the Board of Directors of the International Aerobatic Club and represents the United States internationally at the FAI Aerobatics Commission: Commission Internationale de Voltige Aerienne (CIVA). In addition, she sits on aviation advisory boards for both the City of La Porte and San Jacinto College. In addition, Debby flies as a B737 Captain for Southwest Airlines. A member of the Houston Chapter, she truly loves her multi-faceted flying career, and it shows in her enthusiasm for "everything airplane." As a role model to the students and acquaintances she has inspired during her 40-year career, she finds great reward in their successes.

Dean Jaros was a visionary for the promotion of women in aviation. As a long-time 49 $\frac{1}{2}$, he donated years of service to the Ninety-Nines.

Dean volunteered at a 99 Colorado Chapter Airmarking and quickly determined that he could help the chapter, observing how long it took to lay out a compass rose with the interlocking 99s. He developed and manufactured templates for the nine foot interlocking 99 that enable a quick layout. He also provided many other compass rose aids that enable the chapter to quickly draw centric circles and lay out the four primary directions. Dean volunteered for over ten 99 air-markings across Colorado and Wyoming areas, flying to each at his own expense. He also volunteered and donated his flying time and all expenses, hotels, meals, etc, to be the timer every year for the Mile High Air Derby.

In addition to supporting the Colorado Chapter, Dean flew to and attended over 17 years of 99 International Conferences and Section meetings, always supporting the 99s in any manner he could.

Dean also contributed to the body of knowledge on women in aviation. As a scholar, former professor at Vanderbilt and University of Kentucky and Dean of the Graduate School at Colorado State University, Dean conducted years of extensive and detailed research to produce the ground-breaking book in 1994, Heroes Without Legacy: American Airwomen, 1912-1944. He documented the incredible achievements of women pilots in a day when they often were not recognized in aviation. He traveled to the Air and Space Museum, in Washington and to the Ninety-Nines Museum of Women's Pilots multiple times for his research to prepare for his book.

Dean Jaros personified the values and contributions of the "George Palmer Putnam Award" with the support he demonstrated for 99s in his heart, with his time, his talents, contributions and finances for over 17 years.

Pauline Glasson, 101, of Corpus Christi, Texas, passed away Friday, March 30, 2012 at her home. She was born May 6, 1910 in Boyd, Kentucky to Joseph Early and Frances Butcher Cummins.

She soloed in 1934 at the age of 22 in an Aeronca Sea Plane. She was a life member of the Ninety-Nines an international organization of women pilots, flew all but two of the Powder Puff Derbys and was one of the founders of the Air Race Classic where she was an active and then honorary member of the Board of Directors. She had thousands of hours of flying experience and operated a local flight school.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Claude Glasson; her parents; her sisters, Mildred Lovelace and Sebley Franks; her brothers, Adrian and Jim and Leland Cummins; and her nephew, Donnie Lovelace. She is survived by her sister, Margarite Spears.

A Memorial Mass was celebrated at 11 A.M. Saturday, April 21, 2012 at St. Peter, Prince of the Apostles Catholic Church with Rev. Msgr. Morgan Rowsome as celebrant. A reception followed at Noon in the Parish Hall.

From Dianne about her friend Pauline:

Pauline Glasson was a 99er before either of us could think 99er. You either liked her or hated her------ she was my instrument instructor and a few hundred other pilots could tell you she was their instructor! She once told me that she became an instructor in 1941 and quit flying after 50 years of instructing! Pauline is the reason I ever became involved in the 99ers and I helped her start the Air Race Classic out of Corpus Christi in the early 80s!
