Airport Safety and Security

General

We all know the changes to airport and aviation safety and security at big airports since 9-11. Small airports are no different. Small airports now have their boundaries secure and only pilots and passengers may enter any aircraft movement area. When you attend an event at the airport, always stay inside the areas designated for your group and follow any instructions from personnel assigned to keep you safe inside your area. TSA requires the airport to follow certain rules. Please help ensure these rules are followed.

Dangers at the Airport

Unfortunately, many dangers at the airport are hard to see. People are accidently injured every year at airports by not following simple safety instructions. Never enter a ramp area where aircraft are free to taxi. Please stay in the areas designated for our event. Any time the rotating beacon on top of the tail is on, it means that aircraft engine is about to start.

Common Hazards:

- 1. Turning propellers. A turning propeller can be hard to see. A pilot's view from the cockpit can be restricted. They may not see you approaching an aircraft and could start their engine.
- 2. Prop wash and jet blast. Walking behind an aircraft with the engines running is dangerous. Propellers and engines can churn up flying debris than can cause injury.
- 3. Jet engine induction. Jet engines suck in air from the front. If they are powerful enough, they can pull a person in as well.

- Plan ahead. Give yourself plenty of time to find the Downtown Island Airport.
- Arrive early. We start at 9:30. Any troops not in their assigned groups will miss part of the event.
- This is an outdoor event. Dress for the weather. Bring sun screen or rain protection as appropriate. You will need sturdy shoes, no open toes or flip-flops.
- Make sure your group has something eat before they come.

- If it is very hot think about bringing water.
- Bring or wear a jacket or sweater if it is cool out.

Overview of what to expect Please bring this for reference during the event

After you park you will walk 1-2 blocks to the check-in table located at the main gate behind the terminal building.

Please send one representative from your group to check-in at the table. The Girl Scout Council will have representatives in this area to answer questions and help you organize.

You will receive a package at the registration table. It will contain color coded badges for everyone in your group. Please put them on and move to the spot with the same color sign as your badges. Larger troops may be asked to divide into two different color groups of approximately equal size. You will also receive a sheet listing the order your color group will visit the information stations. Each color group will visit each station in rotation.

At the sound of the start horn, please move to the first information station your color group is listed to visit. Look for the large station numbers at each display. The groups will move through the information stations at approximately 20 minute intervals until each group has visited every station. Listen for the horn to move to the next station.

At the end of the event please return to the check-in table to complete the evaluation form and receive your goody bags with the badges.
