### Proposed SCS Bylaw Amendment DISCUSSION TOPIC FOR THE SPRING SECTION MEETING

#### PREAMBLE

Currently the South Central Section bylaws permit officers to serve a single two-year term within a six year period. Directors are permitted to serve two two-year terms within a six-year period. A member has proposed that the treasurer be permitted to serve two terms within six years, the same as the term limit for directors.

#### ARTICLE VI - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 5. Number of terms

A. Offices. <u>A</u> No person shall hold the office of Governor, Vice-Governor, and Secretary or Treasurer for <u>no</u> more than one term within a six-year period. <u>A person shall hold the office of Treasurer for no more than two terms within a six-year period.</u>

#### Pro:

It is getting increasingly difficult to find candidates for the office of Treasurer. (Possible reasons: Treasurer is a position of fiduciary responsibility that not many want to take on. The need to learn the bookkeeping system and financial reporting, which is complex. The technology has complexities with inter-related spreadsheets. Not everyone is tech-savvy nor comfortable with the process.) Allowing a Treasurer to serve two terms instead of one could allow the business of the corporation to continue uninterrupted.

The officer will be more experienced in her second term and will be more effective.

Con:

Possibility of one officer wielding too much authority.

No introduction of new ideas.

Possible candidates might hesitate to serve two terms but feel pressure to do so.

It could lengthen the time a candidate moves through the different offices and prevent her candidacy because of age-related health or other problems.

Some believe that permitting a second term at the international level is hurting us.



In 1964 she graduated from the University of Nebraska with a Masters in Human Development and Consumer Science. She became an Assistant Professor of Family and Consumer Science, conducting research on widowhood for seniors in Nebraska and China. In her 30 year career, Sally received many professional accolades. including Distinguished Teacher Award and Student Foundation Builders Award for Outstanding Advising.

Husband Dean gave her flying lessons for their 25th anniversary. Dean, a retired air traffic controller, passed away in 2002. They were married for 58 years.

She soloed in 1970, received her private pilot license in 1971 and commercial license in 1974. Over the years, she has flown many types of single-engine aircraft.

Sally joined the International Ninety-Nines and Nebraska 99s in 1971 and remains an active member. She flew in Nebraska air races, poker runs, Wings for Children, one leg in 1977 for the anniversary of air mail, as well as flying to 99s meetings in state and out of state. She assisted at stops of the Powder Puff Derby and Air Race Classic. She was active airmarking hangars and taxiways. As a 99, she served as chairman and treasurer of the Nebraska Chapter. She worked with aerospace education for children and served as an advisor for the South Central Section. Now at age 92, Sally remains active in the Nebraska Chapter and assisted with the joint North Central/South Central Section meeting this past spring.

She loved to take people up to introduce them to flying. Many memorable flights were made to the Bahamas, co-piloting with other 99s, and giving rides to family and anyone interested in flying.


