Discover more than 200 hands-on exhibits and programs at Sci-Port Discovery Center. The center features an IMAX Dome Theatre, laser Space Dome Planetarium and more than 200 hands-on exhibits. The eight-day festival features more than 100 visual artists and four performance stages with music from every genre. You can also see Cold War heroes such as the B-52D and B-52G Stratofortress. We will show you the highest and fastest flying jet aircraft ever – the MACH 3+ SR-71 Blackbird. There are many more on display in our air park.

Last year, August 20, weather delayed the start time of the 38th Annual Okie Derby Air Proficiency Rally, but soon everyone was in the air with US Fleet Tracking providing location of all the planes as they flew along the course – viewed on big screen TV in the lobby at Sundance to the delight of spectators and the scorers. Keenyn Duncan, previous Wings of the Future Scholarship winner was Best Collegiate Pilot, placing fourth. This year's Okie Derby Proficiency Air Rally is Saturday, August 19 staged from Sundance Airport. Gail Foote is Chairman with co-vice chairmen of Cassi Terry and Trina Madden.

This year's Wings of the Future Scholarship was awarded to Lauren McGough whose first love of flight was as a falconer and then a skydiver. She trained birds of prey since 2001. After graduating from OU in 2009, she used her Fulbright Scholarship to document hunting foxes with eagles in Mongolia and did additional fieldwork in Cultural Anthropology at the University of St. Andrews in Scotland. She hopes to conduct aerial surveys of eagle nests and become an aerobatic pilot. Lauren trains injured raptors to return to their wild habitat.

Thanks to all who came to the Fall South Central Section Meeting in Oklahoma City in September. We were pleased to offer a trip to the National Severe Storms area on the Max Westheimer OU campus and to see demonstrations of the weather drones. We had a fabulous reception at Headquarters Friday night. Our own Heather Dirksen, another previous Wings of the Future Scholarship winner, was featured speaker at the banquet. Kudos to Charlene Davis for chairing this meeting.

Charlene Davis and Leona McGee represented our chapter as judges for the NIFA Regional in October, hosted by University of Oklahoma at Max Westheimer in Norman.

We held our annual Christmas Potluck Party at International Headquarters. As usual, we do ourselves proud on the food. Our February Sweetheart Dinner was at Zio's, a favorite Italian restaurant.

We again utilized International Headquarters for our Membership Reception on Sunday, March 5 allowing members and guests to enjoy the Museum of Women Pilots. Denise Neil-Binion, MWP curator, gave a fantastic presentation on early women pilots.

Phyl Howard had a ball representing the Oklahoma Chapter and the Ninety-Nines at a gathering of over 500 Girl Scouts at the Oklahoma History Center in March.

We held our April meeting at International Headquarters where we viewed the video, Silver Wings/Flying Dreams detailing WASP and their training. Our own Suzanna Roberts regaled us further with her account of how doing a term paper on the WASP led her to discover The Ninety-Nines, getting her pilot's license, and then to several times flying some WASP to their reunions in Sweetwater. Susanna also was a Wings of the Future Scholarship awardee and went on to fly KC-135s. Gail Foote and Holly Blunk attended the 2017 WASP Reunion in Sweetwater and had such a wonderful experience that they suggested having the chapter attend as a Fly Away/Drive Away next year.

In May 23 Janis Love, Leona McGee and Carol Sokatch hosted the Governor of the Far East Section, Kyong-O Kim when she visited the Museum of Women Pilots along with Laura and Denise. This woman is an amazing person who was the first women to be licensed to fly in Korea, enlisted in the Korean Air Force and flew combat reconnaissance missions in the Korean War in an L-19 tandem seat plane – dangerous because of flying low and slow, being exposed to enemy fire. She came to the United States in 1958 to attend Guilford College in North Carolina, and was taken under the wings of the New York and New Jersey Sections. To help her achieve owning an airplane, Ninety-Nines amassed over 3 million S&H Green Stamps to purchase a Piper Colt in 1963. That plane is now in the Aviation Museum of Korea. Kim is proud that now 31 women fly in the Korean Air Force.

Angela Drabek, Jody McCarrell, Leona McGee, and Carol Sokatch represented the Oklahoma Chapter at the San Antonio International Conference. Our centerpiece featured pin wheels (Oklahoma is where the wind comes sweeping down the plains, after all) and rose rocks, the official state rock, one of each for each person at the table to take home. Special thanks to the chapters who hosted the Hospitality Room.

The Dallas Chapter announces the passing of our beloved Dorothy Warren on May 3, 2017 at age 85, following a stroke. She had a long and rich history in aviation and dedication to the Ninety-Nines. She began flying in 1955 and held commercial, instrument, and multi-engine ratings, and basic and advanced ground instructor ratings.

Dorothy participated in many air races, including the Powder Puff Derby, Angel Derby, Dallas Doll Derby, Midland Texas High Sky Race, and Sky Lady Derby.

Dorothy joined the Dallas Chapter in 1958. Over the years she served as Chapter Secretary and Chairman, Chairman of a Section Meeting, Secretary and Governor of South Central Section, and as a member of the International Nominating Committee.

In addition to her devotion to The Ninety-nines, Dorothy served as:

- Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Dallas Doll Derby
- FAA Accident Prevention Counselor from 1971–1979
- First Vice President of the Zonta Club of Dallas
- President of the Dallas Chapter of Women's National Aeronautics Assoc
- President of the Dallas Chapter of Aero Sorority
- Volunteer at Frontiers of Flight Museum at Dallas Love Field



She was a member of AOPA, and wrote their "Ladies Co-Pilot Course". With assistance from other 99s, she taught this course for AOPA in Dallas with 65 women in attendance. This was the fore-runner of the Pinch Hitter course.

Dorothy was active in The Ninety-Nines until her death. She charmed and amused Girl Scouts during our seminars with tales from her days flying Powder Puff Derbies, and with pictures of the outfits entrants wore at the time. She attended all Section Meetings, and planned to serve as Dallas Chapter Vice-Chairman for the upcoming fiscal year.

The Dallas Chapter sponsored Dorothy's induction into the Forest of Friendship in June of 2008.

Juanita Waddell - Nov. 10, 1923 - May 17, 2017

Juanita was a voracious traveler who visited 7 continents, including Antartica. Being a 99 meant she could travel with a purpose, and travel she did. Also, she never met a volunteer job she didn't like and spent many hours with The 99s painting compass roses, doing pancake breakfasts, and participating in air races. She was the Fort Worth 99s long-time treasurer.
