

Our hospitality room will also be open Thursday afternoon from 2:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. and again from 7:00 p.m. – 10:00 p.m.

Friday morning also provides ample time to enjoy more of Tyler (or - if you're just arriving - to see the sights) or visit with other 99s in our hospitality room before the Board and Chapter Chairman's meetings Friday afternoon. Friday evening, we head to the Historic Aviation Memorial Museum for a 1950s/1960's themed hangar party and dinner dance. 

Tip of Texas Chapter By Mattie Marcum

June was a busy month for the Tip of Texas Chapter. The month's activities began with a tour of the Corpus Christi International Airport's control tower. Along with Tip of Texas members, pilots from the local EAA chapter attended the facilities tour. Pilots were briefed by watching slides and video describing air controller's duties, which included audio transmissions of radio calls monitored by one controller. The session was followed by a question and answer period. Briefed pilots were allowed to step backstage to see the controllers in action at various stations, from the dark cave of Valley center, approach and delivery, to the bright sunlight of clearance and ground. Our group listened to transmissions as they stood in the tower watching a pair of Navy T45 Goshawk jets fly an overhead break to enter a final approach for runway 13. Members gained a new insight into the complex skills demanded of the ground based controllers.

The month ended with the Tip of Texas members educating attendees, at the June 29th T.P. McCampbell-Porter Airport Fly-In, about the Ninety-Nines, Inc. Attendees were encouraged to meet a women pilot. Children were given aviation word puzzles or airplane kits to assemble and decorate with glitter and stickers. Adults were handed a Ninety-Nines, Inc. fact sheet. Attendees could enter to win a pair of compass earrings by guessing the number of marbles in a glass jar. Two of the Tip of Texas pilots, Ellie Block and Glenna Sue Wood, took an exploratory ride in the Commemorative Air Force's B 25, Devil Dog. Dawn Bissell took a ride in a Van's experimental RV6A. The Tip of Texas Chapter is looking forward to its next aviation educational adventure.






DALLAS 99s by Holly Barr

Junior Girl Scout Aviation STEM Seminars: The Dallas 99s had another successful year administering Junior Girl Scout Aviation STEM Patch Seminars. We held a small one in October at Collin County Regional Airport at McKinney and a large one in February at Frontiers of Flight Museum at Love Field, Dallas. In total, we introduced 78 girls to the wonders of aviation. We initiated plans to expand the topic depths to accommodate Cadettes in the 2013-2014 year.

Airmarking at North Texas Regional Airport: Airmarking reached a new dimension as we painted the aerobatic box center line at North Texas Regional Airport (formerly Grayson County). This was at the request of the airport management and the Lone Star Aerobatic Club for upcoming local, national, and international contests. An aerobatic box is a 1,000 meter (3,300') cube of air beginning 100 meters (328') above the ground.

The original scope was to paint the markings shown here, defining the center line of the box. Two long "dashes" were added on each side of the center "+", which are required under international aerobatic rules.

This was a two-day job, with six members and friends working each day. Despite rain making a mess of our taping after our first day of work and winds gusting to 22kts on our second day, we finished the job and used every drop of paint, for a total of 40 gallons.





As we were finishing at around 5:00, an aerobatic plane took off. We were thrilled! They were using our box and practicing maneuvers!

Here is the schedule for the contests for which we did this work:

- June 20-23: Lone Star Aerobatic Contest
- Sept 21-28: U.S. National Aerobatic Championships
- Oct 9-19: World Aerobatic Championships

Rita's home in Moore was about a mile from Plaza Towers School and only had minor debris to pick up. We enjoyed a video that showed the story of WWII flight surgeon Jim Savage's film shot in England. It features a filming of a Spitfire that had returned from a solo, unarmed reconnaissance flight over Germany crash landing at the base and pilot John Blyth walking away. Savage's relative digitalized the film and then contacted John Blyth. We could see the pilot's reaction as he saw the film recently for the first time and heard his full story.

We hosted a booth at Sundance Airport's Discover Aviation Day on July 15. There were great static displays of planes and lots of kids' activities plus demonstrations by the world's smallest jet owned by Lewis and Clark.
